






Collaboration is key to saving lives. That's why 2022 saw Valley Humane Society urging people to get involved in ways both large and small to make a difference for pets and people in our community. You were instrumental in this effort, modeling the important role community members play in lifesaving outcomes for homeless animals. As shelters everywhere began overflowing due to a sharp increase in animals entering their doors, we took action. To address the deluge, we created and spearheaded Share the Care, a national awareness campaign highlighting the importance of people's support and collaboration with their local animal welfare organizations. Locally, Valley Humane helped alleviate a shortage of available spay/neuter surgeries bottlenecking our rescue partners' adoptions, performing 1,000 more surgeries than in 2021. We eagerly await the imminent opening of our Phil Scholz Veterinary Surgery Center, which will significantly increase our ability to provide veterinary surgery assistance to the public and rescue/shelter partners. Thank you for working together with us to support homeless pets, and reduce the number of animals entering shelters by keeping dogs and cats with their loving guardians. Turning your compassion into action by volunteering, donating, fostering, spreading the word, and working together with Valley Humane Society is the secret sauce to lifesaving.
