

In May, our Phil Scholz Veterinary Surgery Center opened its doors to the public with great fanfare; throughout the year, our veterinary team performed more than twice as many spay/neuter surgeries as in 2022, along with 130+ other surgeries. This incredible increase in capacity benefited cats and dogs all around our community, helping expedite adoptions at nearly three dozen area shelters and rescue groups in addition to being an accessible, lower-cost quality option for personal pets. Alongside these efforts, our dedicated adoption center team rescued and cared for hundreds of adoptable cats and dogs, trained a multitude of willing volunteers, educated and engaged supporters, and assisted pet guardians in meeting the needs of their furry companions, constantly encouraging and strengthening the bond between people and pets. It's that bond we hope to shine a light on in 2024, as we enhance and grow our Canine Comfort pet-assisted therapy program.
